A Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors of the Baca Grande Water and Sanitation District (referred to hereafter as "Board") was held on Friday, the 21st day of October, 2011, at 9:00 a.m. at the offices of the District, BGWS&D Shop, 57 Baca Grant Way South, Crestone, Colorado. The meeting was open to the public.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Johnson, seconded by Director Matthews and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the absence of Martin Macaulay was excused.

DISCLOSURE OF POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

<u>Disclosure of Potential Conflicts of Interest</u>: The Board discussed the requirements pursuant to the Colorado Revised Statutes to disclose any potential conflicts of interest or potential breaches of fiduciary duty to the Board of Directors and to the Secretary of State. Attorney Tanaka noted that conflicts were filed for applicable Directors at least 72 hours prior to the meeting. Director Canaly noted that a quorum was present and requested members of the Board to disclose any potential conflicts of interest with regard to any matters scheduled

for discussion at this meeting. No further conflicts were disclosed.

<u>ADMINISTRATIVE</u> MATTERS

Agenda: Mr. Beckman reviewed the proposed agenda for the District's Regular Board meeting.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Madonna, seconded by Director Johnson and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Agenda was approved, as amended.

<u>Minutes</u>: The Board reviewed the Minutes of the September 30, 2011 Special Meeting.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Johnson, seconded by Director Matthews and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board approved the minutes of the September 30, 2011 Special Meeting, as amended.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Public Comment: There were no comments by members of the public.

WATER MATTERS

Outstanding Water Matters with Water Counsel: Attorney Lock reported that it is unlikely that any new groundwater rules will be imposed in 2011. He reported that Eric Harmon with HRS Water Consultants, Inc. will meet in the near future on behalf of the District with John Gerstle, the Consulting Engineer for the US Fish and Wildlife Service ("USFWS") to discuss certain aspects of the water rights negotiations in progress.

Relocation of Well 17: Attorney Lock reported that the USFWS is willing to take the lead in a change case to adjudicate the relocation of the well. He noted that Mr. Harrell's relationship with Mr. Garcia, in his opinion, has been a key component in getting this matter moved forward.

OPERATIONS

<u>Aspen Wastewater Treatment Facility</u>: Mr. Simons reported that there were no discharge violations in the month of September.

Proposal by Tetra Tech, Inc.: Mr. Beckman discussed the proposal from Tetra Tech, Inc. in the amount of \$22,500 for analysis of the District's current corrosion control plan. He explained for the benefit of the public in attendance that due to the recent concern over OPP in the community, the Board previously directed Mr. Beckman to solicit proposals from a disinterested third party with the expertise to

provide a comprehensive study of all corrosion control treatment options and make a recommendation for an optimal treatment program. The study is expected to take approximately six-months.

Water System served by Motel Well: Mr. Simons reported that Mr. Harrell is researching new pumping options and modifications that will optimize the pumping rates and the efficiency of the pump station.

<u>Vactor Truck</u>: Mr. Beckman reported that the new vactor truck was delivered earlier this week by Boyle Equipment and is now in service and being utilized by the District.

GIS Mapping Project: Attorney Tanaka, Mr. Beckman and Mr. Simons reported on the meeting they had with North Line GIS, LLC last week to review the property interests on one of the parcels. It was noted that they will continue to have monthly meetings until all of the property ownership interests are properly identified and mapped.

Second Addendum to Independent Contractor Agreement between the District and North Line GIS, LLC for Ongoing GIS Services: The Board reviewed the Second Addendum to the Independent Contractor Agreement between the District and North Line GIS, LLC for Ongoing GIS Services.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Matthews, seconded by Director Johnson and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the approved the Second Addendum to the Independent Contractor Agreement between the District and North Line GIS, LLC for Ongoing GIS Services for an amount not to exceed \$4,800.

<u>Proposal from North Line GIS, LLC for Preparation of District Boundary</u>
<u>Map for Statutory Filings</u>: Attorney Tanaka reviewed and discussed the proposal from North Line GIS, LLC for preparation of a District boundary map.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Matthews, seconded by Director Johnson and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board approved the proposal from North Line GIS, LLC for preparation of a District boundary map.

HMO Benefits Schedule: Mr. Beckman reviewed the benefits schedule with the Board and explained that the proposed renewal is for the same coverage. It was noted that the overall premium will depend on the number of employees covered. The monthly premium has increased by approximately \$10 to \$20 per employee per month for the same coverage.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Madonna, seconded by Director Johnson and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board approved the renewal of HMO benefits offered by Colorado Choice health Plans.

<u>CAPITAL</u> IMPROVEMENTS

Capital Projects: Reported below.

Construction Matters:

Change Order No. 21to the Contract with Farner Enterprises, Inc. for the Well 18 Project: Mr. Simons reported that there are no change orders for approval at this time.

Application for Payment No. 15 to the contract with Farner Enterprises, Inc. for the Water and Wastewater System Improvements Project: The Board reviewed Application for Payment No. 15 to the contract with Farner Enterprises, Inc. for the Water and Wastewater System Improvements Project in the amount of \$8,688.04. Mr. Spillane asked for an explanation of the two projects the District is funding. Mr. Simons explained that the water projects and the wastewater projects are subject to different funding sources and are separately identified on the bid schedule.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Johnson, seconded by Director Madonna and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board approved Application for Payment No. 15 to the contract with Farner Enterprises, Inc. for the Water and Wastewater System Improvements Project in the amount of \$8,688.04.

Improvements to Well 18: Mr. Simons reported that the project is substantially complete. He reported that Olsson Associates is requesting warranty replacement of a bearing on one of the pumps at Well 18. Director Madonna asked if the new pumping systems would reduce water-hammer. Mr. Simons reported that the new pumps are equipped with variable speed pumps and controls allowing for graduals start up and pumping rate modulation.

Improvements to the Aspen Wastewater Treatment Facility:

<u>Ultraviolet Light Disinfection System</u>: Mr. Simons reported that the system has been ordered will be installed once it is received.

Effluent Flow Meter: Mr. Simons reported that this will be included with the

telemetry improvements bidding process.

Service Agreements with EPPI for Aspen Wastewater Treatment Facility and the Motel Well Projects: Attorney Tanaka reported that there has been difficulty in getting EPPI to perform the work. She provided a letter last week stating that the company is not progressing as directed and planned and if the work is not complete by October 21, 2011 the District will consider EPPI in default and hire another contractor to finish the project. She further reported that EPPI responded with various explanations. Mr. Simons reported that they will verify the status of EPPI obligations today. It was noted that in the event the work to date is not satisfactory, the District will have the option to terminate the contract.

<u>Decommissioning Mobile Home Estates Wastewater Treatment Facility: Mr.</u> Beckman reported that the District is exploring land fill options for disposal options for decommissioning the facility. Steven Harrell and Mr. Simons are currently researching options.

<u>Proposal for Surveying Regarding an Access Road for the Spiritual Life</u> <u>Institute</u>: Discussion was deferred.

Agreement with Timber Line Electric & Control Corporation for General SCADA and Electrician Services: Mr. Simons reviewed the agreement with the Board and explained that the agreement would be for on-call services and general repairs as needed.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Johnson, seconded by Director Madonna and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board approved the Agreement with Timber Line Electric & Control Corporation for General SCADA and Electrician Services, subject to final review by Mr. Simons and Mr. Beckman.

<u>Proposals for Installation of Effluent Flow Meter at Aspen Waster Water Treatment Facility</u>: Mr. Simons reported that a proposal is not currently available.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

<u>Claims</u>: Mr. Beckman reviewed the payment of claims with the Board through the period ending October 21, 2011 as follows:

Following review and discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Matthews, seconded by Director Johnson and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board approved the payment of the claims for the period ending October 21, 2011.

<u>Financial Statements</u>: Mr. Beckman reported that the September 30, 2011 unaudited financial statements are not available for review.

2012 Draft Budget: Mr. Turtle reviewed the draft 2012 budget with the Board. Mr. Beckman reported that the District will conduct its public hearing on the budget at its November meeting and the proper publications for that hearing will be made prior to the meeting.

<u>Cash Flow Analysis</u>: Mr. Beckman reported that an updated Cash Flow Analysis is not available for review.

Resolution No., 2011-10-01 Certifying Delinquent Water and Sewer Fees to Saguache County Treasurer for Collection: Attorney Tanaka reported that a Notice of Delinquent Account was mailed to each property owner with delinquencies. She reported that there are approximately one hundred and thirty seven (137) customers that will be certified to the County Treasurer for collection. The total amount outstanding is approximately \$25,000.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Johnson, seconded by Director Matthews and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board approved the resolution certifying delinquent water and sewer fees to the Saguache County Treasurer.

LEGAL MATTERS

Assessment of Properties within the District by Saguache County Assessor:

Attorney Tanaka reported that she sent the CORA request to Jackie Stephens, the Saguache County Assessor. Ms. Stephens responded that she could not provide the documents in a timely manner because of computer complications. Attorney Tanaka further reported that Ms. Stephens has been providing semi regular updates since then but only a few parcels at a time. At this point, the District has

approximately ten properties with updated information. Attorney Tanaka will continue to stay on the issue to obtain values for the budget.

Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") with US Forest Service ("USFS") for Cottonwood Creek Plant Traffic Monitoring Efforts: Attorney Tanaka reported that has not seen a response from the USFS since she provided comments to the MOU in early September, at which time the USFS advised her that they were working on getting the MOU circulated for signature.

Road Access and Waterline Updated Easements from Jamie Ireland and Request for Payment of Attorneys' Fees: Attorney Tanaka reported that Mr. Irelands' Attorney requested that the District pay his attorneys' fees for time associated in creating updated easements. Attorney Tanaka reported that she advised Mr. Ireland's Attorney that the request was not reasonable for the following reasons:

- 1. The District paid Mr. Ireland's Attorney's fees, which were unexpectedly high at the time of negotiations.
- 2. The updated easements are being created at the request of Mr. Ireland request, not the District.
- 3. In response to Mr. Ireland's request the District has already incurred surveying and legal costs.

Attorney Tanaka reported that she has not heard back yet from Mr. Ireland's Attorney and recommended that the District not pay any of the fees at this time. Following discussion, the Board agreed with the recommendation.

<u>Line Extension Policy and Recommended Revisions Thereto</u>: Attorney Tanaka reported that the current Line Extension Policy provides for those benefitting from the line extension to pay their proportional share of the total cost. The Agreement does not require the District to provide notice to purchasers whose property is affected by and benefitting from prior line extensions.

She reported that a recent transaction occurred in which a property owner who previously paid for a line extension benefitting multiple properties did not advise a new purchaser of the reimbursement due. The purchaser was unaware of the amount due to the property seller for the prior line extension, and the matter was apparently not disclosed at the time of sale. The seller is now requesting reimbursement. Mr. Beckman and Attorney Tanaka reported on their discussions with the realtor handling the transaction and suggested that the Line Extension Policy be revised to clarify the responsibilities of all parties and to require that all line extension agreements be recorded on the properties affected.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Personnel Matters, Farner Enterprises' Construction Matters, Brown and Caldwell Design Matters and Correspondence to the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment from Porzak Browing & Bushong, LLP: EXECUTIVE SESSION: Pursuant to Sections 24-6-402(4) (b), (e) and (f), C.R.S., upon motion duly made by Director Madonna, seconded by Director Johnson and, upon an affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the quorum present, the Board convened in executive session at 1:15 p.m. for the purpose of discussions relating to personnel matters, negotiations with third parties and receiving legal advice as authorized by Sections 24-6-402(4)(b), (e) and (f), C.R.S.

Furthermore, pursuant to Section 24-6-402(2)(d.5) (II)(B), C.R.S., no record will be kept of those portions of the executive session that, in the opinion of the District's attorney, constitute privileged attorney-client communication pursuant to Section 24-6-402(4)(b), C.R.S.

The Board reconvened in regular session at 1:48 p.m.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Matthews, seconded by Director Johnson and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board approved the engagement of Murphy Decker Hensen & Cook-Olson, P.C. as Special Counsel for litigation purposes with Brown & Caldwell.

Following discussion, upon motion duly made by Director Madonna, seconded by Director Johnson and, upon vote, unanimously carried, the Board approved the Independent Contractor Agreement between the District and Tetra Tech, Inc. for Corrosion Control Plan Analysis Services, subject to final review by Mr. Simons.

Following discussion, the Board determined that the District will need to reevaluate the status of the SCADA system on Monday due to network problems. Mr. Simons recommended that no additional funding be released at this time.

Following discussion, the Board directed Attorney Tanaka to respond via U.S. Mail to the Porzak Browing & Bushong, LLP as requested by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment.

OTHER BUSINESS

<u>Crestone Eagle Article for November Publication</u>: Following discussion Director Johnson volunteered to write an article for the November or December edition regarding the Vactor Truck.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BACA GRANDE WATER AND SANITATION DISTRICT

CERTIFYING DELINQUENT WATER AND SEWER FEES TO SAGUACHE COUNTY TREASURER FOR COLLECTION

WHEREAS, the Baca Grande Water and Sanitation District (the "District") was duly organized and validly exists pursuant to and in accordance with the Special District Act, §§ 32-1-101, et seq., C.R.S.; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to-§ 32-1-1001(1)(j), C.R.S., the Board of-Directors of the District (the "Board") is empowered to fix and from time to time increase or decrease certain fees, rates, tolls, penalties or charges for services, programs or facilities furnished by the District; and

WHEREAS, the District currently imposes various water and sewer fees upon properties receiving services furnished by the District; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to §32-1-1101(1)(e), C.R.S., the District is permitted to have certain delinquent fees, rates, tolls, penalties, charges or assessments made or levied by the District certified to the County Treasurer for collection in the same manner as taxes; and

WHEREAS, the properties reflected on **Exhibit A**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Delinquent Properties"), are delinquent in their water and sewer fees by at least six (6) months and by more than One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150); and

WHEREAS, the Delinquent Properties have outstanding delinquent fees rates, tolls, penalties, charges or assessments in the amounts set forth in **Exhibit A** (the "Delinquent Fees"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to §32-1101(1)(e), C.R.S., the District may elect, by resolution, at a public meeting held after receipt of notice by the Delinquent Properties, to certify the Delinquent Fees to the County Treasurer for collection; and

WHEREAS, the District has provided notice to the Delinquent Properties and considers adoption of this Resolution at a public meeting; and

WHEREAS, the District, by this Resolution, desires to certify the Delinquent Fees to the County Treasurer for collection.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE BACA GRANDE WATER AND SANITATION DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

1. <u>CERTIFICATION OF DELINQUENT FEES</u>. The Board hereby elects to have the Delinquent Fees certified to the County Treasurer be collected and paid over by the County Treasurer in the same manner as taxes are authorized to be collected and paid over pursuant to § 39-10-107, C.R.S. The Board hereby directs the District's General Manager to certify to the County Treasurer the Delinquent Fees set forth in **Exhibit A**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Certification"). Such Delinquent Fees shall be certified by no later than October 29, 2011 in order to comply with State statutory and County certification deadlines.
